The \$358,000 modification to this contract does not increase the overall HDC JPA FY24 Budget because the funds will be reallocated from unexpended funds in the current budget. These additional tasks are related to right-of-way planning and environmental/conceptual engineering design activities to reflect the minor adjustment made to the route alignment.

Recommended Action:

A. Approve the High Desert Corridor Joint Powers Agency Proposed Fiscal Year 2024-2025 Budget of \$6,174,000. Attachment A – HDC JPA Proposed FY24-25 Budget and HDC JPA Current FY23-24 Budget.

B. Authorize the Executive Director and Los Angeles County Counsel to execute all necessary funding agreements with Metro.

C. Authorize the Executive Director contractual signing authority for an amount not to exceed \$299,000.

D. Authorize the Executive Director to continue the agreement with Los Angeles County Public Works for procurement support services.

Highlights of Proposed Fiscal Year 2024-2025 Budget/Background:

- Extend the contract for one year with Transportation Solutions to complete the CEQA addenda/NEPA environmental clearance process with the Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) as the federal lead with the petition filed with the Surface Transportation Board for interoperability with other high-speed rail systems. With the completion of these environmental compliance items, the HDC JPA high speed rail project will be positioned to pursue federal, state, and local funds for the next phase of development which is design/engineering. Contract extension for the period of July 1, 2024 to June 30, 2025 for a not to exceed cost of \$977,350.
- Extend the professional services contract with AVS Consulting, Inc. to provide the HDC JPA with executive director and agency administration support services including subcontracting additional senior level management and administrative support services staff to conduct project management functions and additional administrative activities. As the high speed rail project develops, AVS Consulting, Inc. will need to add subcontracted staff with no change to the hourly rate structure. The contract extension is for the period of July 1, 2024 to June 30, 2025 for a not to exceed amount of \$1,188,800.

- Financial Advisory Services firm funding for ongoing financial planning, modeling, and analysis that will be required to support project development into the preliminary engineering phase that includes to further develop and refine the funding plan, analyze options for local funding contributions toward the project, assess alternative delivery options and the viability of public-private partnerships through a Value for Money analysis, provide updated ridership forecasting as needed, perform additional financial modeling and diligence on financing options, identify credit enhancement strategies, and support discussions with potential market participants. For FY25, it is estimated that \$1,165,000 will fund the FA contractor to perform work at a level of effort that may be required for financial modeling and grant management. The total FA contract is \$3.5M over three years.
- Procure the professional services of a Program Management/Construction Management Support Services (PMC) firm to the HDC JPA with overseeing the work related to Preliminary Engineering (PE) including development of statement of work, contract development, contract administration support, federal and state grant agreement compliance, procurement support services, set and monitor program control and project scheduling control functions, cost estimating, configuration management, project management, and other support services. For FY25, it is estimated that \$1,035,000 will fund the PMC contractor to perform work at a level of effort that will be commensurate with transitioning from the environmental phase into the PE phase of the project that will consist of developing the Preliminary Engineering (PE) statement of work and contract development.
- Service Development Plan (SDP). Metro will continue as lead on the HDC Service Development Plan (SDP) to be submitted to FRA for final consideration in FY25. The current January 2023 SDP requires additional analysis and cost updates due to the alignment, structural, and operational changes made to the Project since January 2023 and new FRA requirements. This budgeted amount will be reimbursed to the HDC JPA through the Federal Railroad Administration Corridor Identification Grant funds awarded in December 2023.
- The County of Los Angeles will be providing auditing, controller, procurement support and legal counsel services for an estimated amount of \$665,000 from July 1, 2023 to June 30, 2024.
- Authorize the Executive Director to continue the agreement with Los Angeles County Public Works for procurement support services.
- Community-based stakeholder engagement funding is available and will continue to be strategically important in the upcoming phase of project development.
- The Executive Director signing authority is \$299,000, below the \$330,000 signing authority of the County Director of Public Works per Los Angeles County Code Section 2.18.030.

In April 2023, the HDC Board extended the contract performance period with no hourly rate increase from July 1, 2023, to June 30, 2024, for a total contract value of \$430,000.

AVS Consulting currently oversees agency management including technical analysis, grant applications, budgetary activities, equity focused planning, administration, engineering, rightof-way planning, stakeholder engagement and communications. For FY25, HDC JPA management functions will be augmented to meet the increased project needs requiring the services of a senior level project management/planning, engineering and right-of-way planning support, communications staff, and administrative support staff. As the project progresses beyond the environmental phase into preliminary engineering and final design, the HDC JPA requires additional staffing to support the increasing complexity, expertise, and level of effort.

AVS Consulting, Inc. will need to add sub-contracted staff with no change to the hourly rate structure for the period of July 1, 2024, to June 30, 2025, for a not to exceed amount of \$1,188,800.

- **A.** Find that the award of contract is not a project pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act.
- **B.** Award contract to InfraStrategies LLC for Professional Financial and Business Advisory Services in the amount of \$3,500,000 for a three-year base contract with two one-year options.
- **C.** Authorize the Executive Director and Los Angeles County Counsel, representing HDC JPA, to execute the contract.
- D. Requirements: Executive Director to execute amendments to: (a) exercise the term extension options to extend the term of the Agreement for up to two additional one-year periods; (b) add, delete, and/or change Agreement terms and conditions that are non-substantive, required by the HDC JPA Board of Directors, or necessary for compliance with applicable law; (c) approve necessary changes to scope of services; (d) supplement the initial not-to-exceed contract amount of \$3,500,000 by up to 15% contingency of the original contract amount based on workload requirements; and, (e) to suspend and/or terminate the contract for convenience.

Background

Also, Public Works informed 902 Community Business Enterprises, 164 Social Enterprises, 150 Disabled Veterans Business Enterprises, 1,514 Local Small Business Enterprises: 1,380 Community Based Organizations, and 2,061 firms with the Department of Economic Opportunity about this business opportunity.

The consultant services agreement has a nine-percent (9%) Disadvantaged Business Enterprise goal.

The Proposers were requested to demonstrate their good faith efforts to utilize Disadvantaged Business Enterprises. A Preproposal conference was held on December 18, 2023, and proposals were due January 23, 2024. There were 27 firms registered on the Public Works website for the RFP and three proposals were received by three consulting teams (See Attachment B).

The proposals were evaluated by an evaluation committee consisting of Metro, Los Angeles County Public Works, and City of Palmdale Public Works. The evaluation was based on criteria described in the Request for Proposals, which included price, experience, work plan, and references, utilizing the informed averaging methodology for applicable criteria.

Based on the evaluation of the three proposals, the consulting team of InfraStrategies LLC was selected without regard to race, creed, color, or gender. The firm selected represents the highest-rated, responsive, and responsible firm to provide the required services.



With California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) concurrence, this will complete environmental clearance for the high-speed rail project to advance to the next phase of Project Development, which is to conduct 30% level of design engineering.

2. HDC JPA FY24 Work Program Implementation

On May 25, 2023, the Metro Board of Directors unanimously approved the HDC JPA FY24 Budget Work Program of \$1,947,500 from Measure M funds. As part of the HDC FY24 Work Program, the HDC JPA entered an MOU on September 5, 2023, with Los Angeles County Public Works to provide contracting and other supportive services for the procurement of professional services and architectural and engineering services. As part of the FY24 Work Program, the HDC JPA is currently working with LA County Public Works and LA County Counsel on two contracting opportunities: one to procure Financial Advisory Services to be awarded at the April 2024 JPA Board meeting, and another to procure Project Management and Construction Support Services likely to be released in April/May to award at the HDC JPA Board of Directors meeting in October 2024 or January 2025.

2. HDC JPA FY24 Work Program Implementation

On May 25, 2023, the Metro Board of Directors unanimously approved the HDC JPA FY24 Budget Work Program of \$1,947,500 from Measure M funds. As part of the HDC FY24 Work Program, the HDC JPA entered an MOU on September 5, 2023, with Los Angeles County Public Works to provide contracting and other supportive services for the procurement of professional services and architectural and engineering services. As part of the FY24 Work Program, the HDC JPA is currently working with LA County Public Works and LA County Counsel on two contracting opportunities: one to procure Financial Advisory Services to be awarded at the April 2024 JPA Board meeting, and another to procure Project Management and Construction Support Services likely to be released in April/May to award at the HDC JPA Board of Directors meeting in October 2024 or January 2025.

Furthermore, as part of the environmental clearance process, we need to conduct additional tasks pertaining to right-of-way planning and environmental/conceptual engineering activities requiring \$358,000, and additional tasks related to LA County procurement staff support services requiring an additional \$47,000, for a total of \$405,000. Although there is no fiscal impact to the adopted FY24 Budget, it is requiring the HDC JPA to reallocate a total of \$405,000 from the budget line items initially funding Task 3) Program Management Support Services

(\$240,000), and Task 5) Technical/Planning & Grant Funding Application Assistance (\$165,000). This reallocation results in the budget line-item Task 1) Re-evaluate National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) & Record of Decision (ROD) to increase from \$710,000 to \$1,068,000. The consultant contract to conduct this work will be modified to reflect the additional work and is described in the HDC JPA Agenda Report-Board Item 11 for consideration by the HDC JPA Board of Directors at their regular meeting on April 11, 2024.
